

Audiology

The East Lancashire Hearing and Balance Service comprises of Adult and Paediatric Audiology. This well established department operating from modern, high quality facilities provides hearing and balance care for the local population.

What we do

We provide services for testing your hearing and fitting digital hearing aids, including aural rehabilitation where appropriate. We offer complex services including the investigation and rehabilitation of dizziness/balance problems and we also provide specialist care in tinnitus (noises in the head) and rehabilitation.

We have a specialist paediatric (children's) unit to assess hearing, diagnose hearing problems and look after children with a hearing problem.

Paediatric Audiology specialises in the assessment of hearing of babies and children from Newborn up to leaving full time education, the age of the latter depending on the needs of the young person.

We undertake a range of hearing tests depending on the age of the child. For children with a temporary hearing problem, that requires a medical opinion, onward referral to our Ear Nose and Throat (ENT) colleagues will be arranged.

Management of a hearing problem that requires hearing aid provision will be arranged locally, with onward referral to our Paediatrician for investigation in to the possible cause of the hearing loss.

Children with hearing aids will be seen at regular intervals for assessment and management. This well established, modern department has always been at the forefront of innovative ways of working and has been recognised by the Department of Health Action on ENT and Action on Audiology programmes. Examples of Innovation in practice include:

- Audiologist led grommet follow-up clinics
- Audiologist led wax removal with micro-suction
- Patient focus groups
